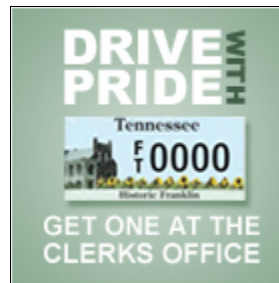

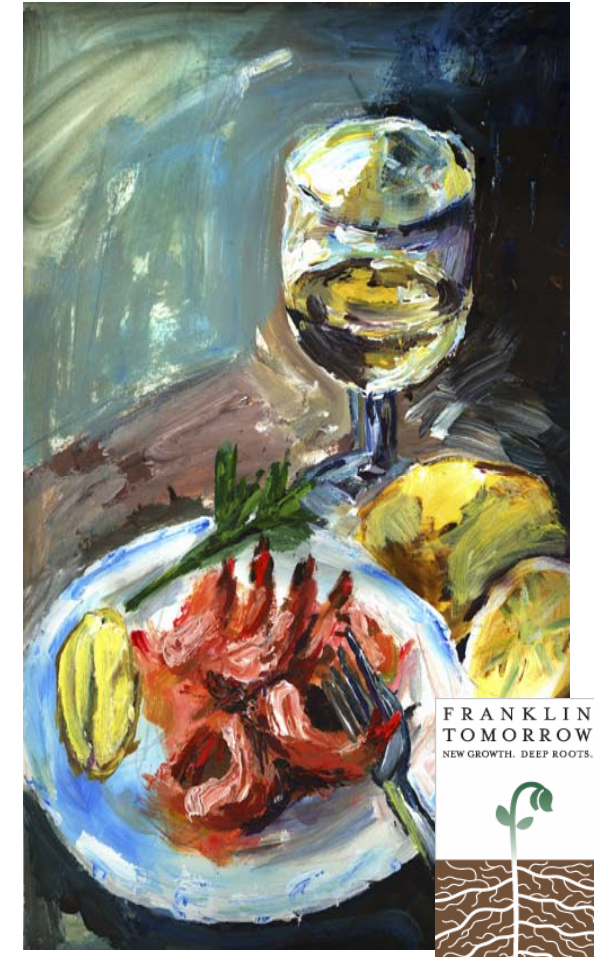

Anne T. Rutherford Exemplary Community Volunteer Award

Individuals eligible for this award are involved in a variety of community activities. This collective effect of their work has impact on the agencies themselves and the community at large. Consideration is given to each nominee's variety of work and overall impact. One award is given in this category annually. We look for heart of service and a dedication to the community at large.

Finalists:

Andy Menzyk- Is being recognized for his work with United Way, the Animal Control Task Force, and his service for the Advisory Committee for the business college at M.T.S.U

Isaac Brown-Is being recognized for his 24 years of service on the board for the Williamson Medical Center

John Green-Is being recognized for his work with the Boy Scouts of America and with the Fourth Avenue Church of Christ.

Ned Lea Volunteer Contribution Award

This award has been established to honor the contribution of a volunteer posthumously. Individuals eligible for this award are involved in a variety of community activities and would be considered eligible for the Anne T. Rutherford Exemplary Community Volunteer award. Up to one award is given annually. We look for heart of service and a dedication to the community at large. This year we would honor the life of Williamson County's own Ned Lea in naming this award.

Ned Lea- Is being recognized for his work with The Land Trust. He was an active member of Garrison United Methodist Church and The Harpeth River Watershed Association.

Volunteer Spirit Awards

Individuals eligible for these awards are involved either in a variety of community activities or primarily in one organization as a significant volunteer. The effect of their work, either collectively in the community or primarily in one organization, has a profound impact. This individual stands out as altering the environment around them simply by their service and heart for their community. Three awards are given in this category annually.

Finalists:

Andy Menzyk, Isaac Brown and John Green

Amy Law- Is being recognized for her work with WAVES and the Middle & TN Association of Child Care Agencies.

David Crane- Is being recognized for his work with Hard Bargain Mt. Hope Redevelopment, Fellowship Baptist Church in Williamson County, The Resource Foundation, Affordable Housing Resources, and The Home Builders Association of Middle TN.

David Garrett- Is being recognized for his work with The Heritage Foundation and all aspects of community preservation.

Ginger Smith- Is being recognized for her work with the Williamson County Child Advocacy Center Task Force. An organization of caring professional who wanted to provide quality services to child abuse victims.

Lori Orme- Is being recognized for her work with A Vintage Affair, an organization that is dedicated to providing non-profits with financial contributions.

Rudy & Peter Jordan- Are being recognized for their work as the founding blocks of the Franklin Preservation Movement.

Youth Initiative Award

Individuals eligible for this award are under the age of 21 and are involved either in a variety of community activities or primarily in one organization as a significant volunteer. The effect of their work, wither collectively in the community or primarily in one organization, has profound impact. This individual stands out as setting a standard of service for the youth community. One award is given in this category annually.

Finalists:

Baker Watkins-Is being recognized for his work with Labor of Love , an organization that makes blankets, scarves, and collects food for the homeless.

Mariel D'Andrea- Is being nominated for her work with the Franklin Chapter of Becca's Closet., a national non-profit that provides prom dresses for needy women at no cost.

Meredith Medlin-Is being recognized for her work with Feed Our Souls. An outreach program to feed the needy.

Flood Relief Exceptional Volunteer Award

This award has been established for this year, however, it may be extended into an overall Disaster Relief award. This year's nominees are being honored for their exceptional dedication to the Flood Relief effort in May of this year. These two individuals represent a community who pulled together during the Historic Flood of 2010.

Angela Overstreet-Is being recognized for her leadership of over 130 volunteers during flood relief efforts.

Bennie Woolam- Is being recognized for his willingness to help his neighbors with projects even as he nears 100 years old.
